

For Madison Timmons, soccer has always been more than just a sport—it's been a constant through years of change, travel, and growth. As a military child who has lived and played in Texas, Tennessee, and Ohio, Madison learned early how to adapt to new environments and coaching styles. When she moved to Northern New York, her coach at Eastern Elite Academy connected her with Syracuse Development Academy — a move that would shape her future on and off the field.

"SDA has a place for everyone," Madison shared. "Regardless of your commitment

level or talent, SDA can help you develop your game. I was able to play at both the GA and GA2 levels, and because I was a multisport athlete, I'll now have the opportunity to compete in both soccer and track at Heidelberg." Playing at both levels gave Madison a unique perspective on SDA's flexibility and depth. "The GA2 level had less of a commitment but still a high level of play," she explained. "We trained two days a week instead of three, which gave me the balance I needed. This season, as I prepare for college, I'll be training with the O8GA team to improve my speed of play."

Madison also credits the SDA coaching staff for their support during the recruiting process. "Coach Joe Zingaro and Coach Pao were amazing," she said. "They emphasized communicating with college coaches and were always available for guidance. I used to CC them on every email I sent, and they'd give me great feedback on next steps."

Looking back, some of Madison's favorite memories revolve around the friendships and team culture. "The relationships are what I'll miss most," she said. "Spending weekends both on and off the field with the best talent in Syracuse, the team dinners, and even the post-game shopping trips — those are moments I'll never forget."

Competing at the GA level taught Madison the importance of precision and composure. "Your first touch is critical—it sets the tone for the entire play," she explained. "Playing at that pace helped me make quicker, smarter decisions under pressure and strengthened my time management skills balancing academics, practices, and travel."


EMMA HILL AMHERST COLLEGE

SDA 2012 GA Girls Take England by Storm!

The SDA 2012 GA Girls — joined by one 2011 and two 2013 players — took their game overseas for an unforgettable soccer trip to England! It was an adventure packed with competition, culture, and plenty of laughs both on and off the field. The team participated in three top-tier training sessions with English Premier League Academy coaches. The sessions sharpened their skills, strengthened teamwork, and offered valuable insights into the English style of play. The highlight for many came during their friendly matches against local teams — the girls went an impressive 3-0 on their first international stage, scoring 14 goals and allowing only 2, with two shutouts!

Off the pitch, the group soaked up the full English experience—touring the iconic stadiums of Liverpool, Manchester United, and Chelsea, and even catching live Premier League action at Liverpool and Chelsea men's matches. They also explored Wrexham, Chester, Manchester, Stratford-upon-Avon (Shakespeare's birthplace), and of course London. The girls stood outside Buckingham Palace, rode the London Eye, and even visited the club where the Beatles first performed.

It was the perfect blend of travel, training, and teamwork — a trip that created lasting memories and lifelong friendships.


